Why Stanton is Special

David Mollenhoff presented a lecture at the Swedish Heritage and Cultural Center on Saturday, Sept. 30, about his new book, The Mollenhoff Family Odyssey: From Swedish Subjects to American Citizens.

David grew up visiting his grandparents, Ernest and Sadie Freed Mollenhoff, in Stanton. He grew fond of the little city and all it had to offer, and the town always held a special place in his memories.

"Writing a book is always a voyage of discovery," Mollenhoff said. "You learn things that force you to change certain concepts that you thought were true. Therefore, I must begin my talk by explaining how my research forced me to change my fundamental concept of my book in two important ways. First, when I began to research this book, I thought I was doing a family biography. And I was, But as the manuscript evolved, I realized that I was writing about something much bigger—the age old human quest to create a society where all people can realize their full potential—and that my Swedish ancestors and Stanton were active participants in this epic story.

"Second, I came to understand that Stanton, when viewed against a backdrop of Swedish immigration, was far more important than I had realized."

Mollenhoff shared history of Stanton's beginning and the powerful vision Bengt Magnus Johannsson Halland had when he began the colony. He shared how the community grew to become a town where all the people shared character-related values and offered a variety of opportunities for all the members of the town. And he shared memories of the second generation Americans, Ernest and Sadie Mollenhoff, his grandparents, from their time in Stanton.

The town of Stanton is the focus of chapter six in his book and is filled with photos from the late 1800s to the mid 1950s.

David's grandparents were a great asset to the town of Stanton, and chapter six shares many facets of the Mollenhoff lives, as well as the children, Vincent and Dorothy. David is the son of Vincent.

"I asked my father what it was like to grow up in Stanton and he replied with one word: 'idyllic.'"

The SHCC held a social hour prior to the lecture, and a meal following. About 50 people were in attendance.

David donated copies of the book and they can be purchased at the SHCC for \$20.

"I donated the books so all proceeds will go to the historical society," David said. "I want the historical society to enjoy the revenue."

David lives in Madison, Wisconsin where he enjoyed a variety of careers. This is the second book he has authored and he has co-authored a book as well.


